


#### Parkinson's Disease

- Causes
  - -Genetic
  - –Environmental (trauma, toxins)
    - CO, pesticide (CS2), copper, etc
    - Gut-brain
- Risk Factors
  - -Age
  - –Family history
  - -Male gender
  - Environmental
- What happens
  - Brain nerve cells break down or die
    - Mostly Dopamine releasing cells



## Progression of Parkinson's Disease

- **Stage 1:** Lower brainstem/Olfactory (e.g. constipation, loss smell)
- **Stage 2:** Up brainstem just below sustantia nigra (pain, sleep, mood)
- **Stage 3:** Substantia nigra (slow movement, rigidity, freezing, tremor)
- Stage 4: More dopamine cells lost, move up toward limbic (movement, emotions, motivation, long term memory, progression loss smell)
- **Stage 5:** Spread higher to brain, start to lose higher functions (perception, cognition, language)
- **Stage 6:** Late stage spread to cerebral cortex affecting memory, motor and sensory functions





## PD Symptoms

#### CLASSIC "CARDINAL" FEATURES

- 1. Tremor pill rolling
- 2. Bradykinesia slowness of movement
- 3. Rigidity increased resistance to movement
- 4. Postural instability imbalance, tendency to fall with significant injury risk

#### Nonmotor symptoms of Parkinson disease

Cognitive dysfunction

Psychosis

Mood disorders (depression, anxiety, apathy/abulia)

Sleep disturbances

Fatigue

Autonomic dysfunction (urinary urgency/frequency, constipation, orthostasis, erectile dysfunction)

Olfactory dysfunction

Pain and sensory disturbances

Dermatologic findings (seborrhea)

#### Cannabis Overview

#### Cannabis – The Plant

• sativa, indica

Cannabinoid – unique molecules found in Cannabis plant

- CBD
- THC

Terpenes - Terpenes are fragrant essential oils that give cannabis and other plants their aromatic diversity (ie not Cannabis specific)



## Methods of Consumption

- Sublingual/buccal:
  - Hold oil 45-60 sec
  - Onset 30min, peak 2h, dissipate 8-12h
  - Wait >2h between doses
- Edible:
  - 30min-2h onset, variable peak
  - Wait >3h before re-dose (usu 1-2x/d)
- Topical
  - Variable onset and duration (carrier dependent)
  - Less system side effects
  - Local effects only

- Smoke (least favoured)
  - Tar, CO, carcinogens
  - Possibly higher "high"
  - Best use water bong
- Vaporize:
  - Heat dried product/oil in vaporizer to user-assigned temp
  - Inhale, hold 3-5 sec
  - Wait 5 min between doses







- Inflammation


## PerceiveMD PAIN Stats

- Average dose 25-50 mg/d
- 76% had some improvement
  @ 1 month
- 82% had some improvement
   @ 3+ months
- Average pain PRIOR to starting cannabis 7.4/10
- Average reduction pain 48% (3.8/10)
  - 14% experienced >80% improvement




## PerceiveMD TREMOR Stats

- Average dose 25 mg/d
- 79% experienced some improvement @1 month




## PerceiveMD INSOMNIA Stats

- Average dose 26 mg/d (10-50 mg/d)
- 76% had some improvement in sleep
  @ 1 month
- 83% @ 3+ month



## PerceiveMD ANXIETY Stats

- Average dose 27mg/d
- 79% showed some improvement with anxiety @ 1 month
- 87% showed some improvement @ 3+ months



Are there risks to taking cannabis?

## YES

#### Side Effects-THC

- Euphoria ("high")
- Drowsiness
- Imbalance
- Dizziness
- Dry mouth
- Palpitations
- Worsening of anxiety and depression mostly with long term use of higher doses
- Hallucinations usually dose dependent (i.e. higher dose = higher chance)




### Side Effects - CBD

- Loose stool/diarrhea
- Feel energized (rare)
- Dizziness or light-headedness (possibly more due to THC component)



### Addictions - THC



#### Addiction risk - CBD

- No documented risk of addiction or withdrawal symptoms
- Some studies suggest role as intervention for other addictions
  - -Cocaine
  - -Opioids
  - –Other psychostimulants
  - -+/- cannabis + tobacco



Should I just get cannabis from a store and try it out myself?

NO

- No medical supervision
  - Dosing
  - Side effects
  - Drug interactions
- No extended benefit coverage/tax deductible
- No product selection help

#### How much does medical cannabis cost?

#### •OIL:

- >\$0.09-0.11/mg CBD
- >\$0.09-0.14/mg THC
- •Capsule\*:
  - >\$0.11-0.15/mg CBD
  - >\$0.13-0.17/mg THC
- •1000 mg oil ~\$90
  - >@ 25mg/d use-> 40 days
